to donate there is a container in the Narthex marked LAMP where you can place your donations.





Stewardship Thoughts

We've all seen the HOW and WHAT of stewardship through the budgeting process and preparation and voting on the budget ending in blind, subconscious submission of the Sunday offering. What if the congregation were willing to take the time to start with the WHY of stewardship as it is delivered to us from the Word of God? If so, there would be a far better



grounding of stewardship among those who have been called by God to be part of the body of Christ in the local congregation. The WHY of stewardship starts with creation, the cross, Baptism and the Christian life. The Christian steward has been created, and through Holy Baptism, recreated (born again) to be a steward of all things for God and God's purposes. It has nothing to do with paying bills, but everything to do with being faithful to The Lord and reaching out to others.

Stewards are caretakers and managers for the gifts God has entrusted to them; the most important the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Lord has made and redeemed us to steward all things entrusted to us for the sake of others. The steward does not exist to sustain the church. Scripture tells us The Lord is tasked with sustaining the church. The task of the steward is to be faithful with those gifts The Lord has given. This faithfulness is then used by The Lord to bring the Gospel to those who do not know it. Money is given to the local congregation so the preaching of the Gospel and education of the young and old alike may be carried out. The local congregation partners with other congregations to accomplish the mission of the Church locally, regionally, nationally and internationally.

It is the Gospel that serves as the WHY of stewardship. Stewardship is not about our benevolence toward others or even the congregation. It flows from who God made us to be and for whom The Lord has made us to serve. When giving is proportional and sacrificial, when service is rendered to others in response to the way The Lord has served the individuals who make up the congregation, the Gospel is carried forth and a difference is made by the work of the Holy Spirit through the Word.

It is time for pastors and people alike to commit to discovering the WHY of stewardship from the Scriptures and Confessions.

Photography Camp (July 30-August 4) Spend the week with your camera in hand, building your photography skills and capturing awesome pictures.


