O death, where is your sting?"



Thank you, Lord, for the blessing of Easter and life eternal.









How do we contact him/her? That is a good question that has been asked lately. There are times when we want to reach someone and we can't because their cur-


rent phone number has changed, been disconnected, unreachable. One current one is reaching our webmaster for our website. There hasn't been



And catching up on what happened this week and talking about sports or the weather is hardly what Jesus had in mind when he told us to love one another.

But the truth is the real mission of the church is relationship. It defines the vertical nature of our faith (love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength) and the horizontal essences of Christianity (love your neighbor as yourself). If anyone can get relationship right, it should be the church. So ask yourself as a church leader: what are you doing to forge the deepest relationships you can forge in this life?








An elderly woman
