


3 Year Old Preschool

"A good man takes care of his animals"


6/25 | Take Care Of The Earth

School-Age Scoop

Finally-summer vacation is here! Depending what side of the fence you sit on, you may be excited (as I am sure our school-agers are), or feeling overwhelmed with all the activities summer brings (like me). Either way, the summer will fly by!

Currently, we have ten full-time clients and seven drop-ins. We're happy to welcome back some familiar faces returning for summer, like **Nicholas W.**, and **Eric & Samantha M.** Room is still available if you know of anyone looking for care.

I'm happy to have Ms. Tina returning as my partner, so that a couple days each week I can catch up on my office work.

Each school-ager will have his or her own cubby downstairs, which we will use for correspondence, projects, etc. The goal is to have the children empty cubbies at least once a week. Children may bring up to three toys from home, but due to limited space, toys must be able to fit in the cubby space. Toys from home will be shared with other children.

Children may bring personal gaming devices, such as DS or Gameboys. All games should be rated "E" for everyone, and not involve fighting or violence. School-age "screen" time will be limited to one free choice period per day. (If you would prefer your child NOT play video games while at the center, please let us know.)

To fully enjoy our summer activities, schoolagers need to have sunscreen and water bottles for outside play. If you haven't already received a medicine authorization form for sunscreen, let me know. Also, we ask that children have tennis shoes or sandals with ankle straps for outside play.

Each week, we will be having a different thematic unit. In our first few weeks together, we will be talking about friendship, planting and the circus. We are excited to start out the summer with a Chapel visit with Pastor Hyvonen. We are also hoping to schedule some other fun days throughout the summer.
