Here we are October, as I look back it seems September was a very long month, and then as I look at the calendar I realized there are still 10 days to go as I write this. The weather is drizzly, windy, and cold, and I hear a nap calling if I don't push through it. It has been a very trying month with emotions and feelings reaching every place from very high to very low.

As I sit and reflect, a conversation I had with a friend this morning comes to mind. In that conversation we were talking about life, and not only life itself, but life and death and our time in this world. My friend was telling me he was with an acquaintance of his just the day before when the acquaintance received a call saying that his son had died. He spoke of being dumbfounded and not knowing what to say as his friend departed to be with family. We spoke of how suddenly we can experience life changing events and how life is full of unknowns. Then the conversation moved to the topic of faith. And we discussed what it must be like for someone who has no faith to face such a crisis. We spoke of how as Christians, even when we face the un-faceable, as long as we have faith, we have hope. Without faith, there is no hope.

It reminded me of the section from the sermon last week where I spoke of the Epicureans, who's philosophy was to live for today, don't get attached to anything in this world because someday it will all be gone. The problem of course, life without attachments brings no joy. Without faith, things just end, either that or people cling to a sort of misguided hope or thought that perhaps they or their loved one were good enough, and God, or whatever higher power they may believe in will take care of them, but there are no assurances, no hope of every being together again. I cannot imagine living that way, just thinking and believing that when our life ends it is simply over.

Praise be to God and thanksgiving for the knowledge that because of God's love for us, He restored His fallen creation, us. Through the life, death, and resurrection of His Son, our savior, Jesus Christ, we have the assurance of everlasting life. And the best part is, it's not based on what we have done, but what Christ did. We know that when we lose a friend or relative it is not good bye forever, it is until we meet again. Scripture tells us over and over again that through Christ, through our faith, our place in heaven is secure. If I die tomorrow, my loved ones don't have to worry about whether or not I have done enough to be saved, they and I have the assurance that because I have been baptized and believe we will meet again on that last day. Sometimes we worry, sometimes we question, sometimes we doubt, all of those things are human things, all of those things happen because we are sinful people living in a sinful world, but even with all of those things as long as we do what Paul reminds us in Romans 10:9 If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord,

"and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."





### Of the Word

Today's schedule: go to work, pick up groceries, make a casserole and take it to a sick friend, help with the children's homework, make lunches for tomorrow, put kids to bed, fall asleep during the late news. When our day is so hectic, how can we add "prayer time" to an already overly committed schedule?

Maybe the solution is to incorporate prayer into every event of our day. While preparing the meal for a sick friend, pray for her needs and ask God for the wisdom to bring her words of comfort. When you drop off the meal, ask to pray with her. Before your family meal, add petitions for family concerns. When the worries of the day keep you awake at night, turn to God in prayer.

Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise (James 5:13).

### **Stewardship Thoughts**

Are you surprised by "stewardship?" Are we, as a congregation, surprised by "stewardship?" We are surprised when in the fall the church's ministries fire up to full speed after a summer lull of vacations and leisure activities have allowed these ministries to wind down. Sunday School needs to be staffed, Bible studies need planning, Comfirmation needs to be taught. We go from dormant to full speed in a matter of weeks.

Stewardship programs are no different. We go from dormant to full speed and ask "what do we do now?" If the topic is avoided altogether and we talk about the use of money and finances for the sake of the Kingdom, the surprise of stewardship catches us. When the resources aren't there for ministry and panic sets in - "what do we do now?"

This is avoided when we realize every child of God has been created and redeemed for stewardship. No one who is in the Lord's House, the Lord's Word and at the Lord's Table should be surprised at being called a steward. It is only when this identity is ignored that there is surprise. The faithful teaching and preaching of the whole councel of God, including stewardship, will not allow for this surprise.

Every baptized child of God is a steward. Age, gender, health, wealth, ability or any other limitation do not preclude a child of God from being a steward. This is because everything in creation, including the individual steward, belongs to God. The steward manages all that belongs to the Lord to the pleasure of the one who wills it - The Lord.

Intentional teaching and leading of stewardship is a yearlong task. Stewardship can be highlighted in Bible study and Sunday School when the texts call for it. Calling for faithful stewardship can be done weekly from the pulpit from lessons in the Lectionary. Board and committee meetings should be tempered with the idea that stewardship works here as well.


Zion's LWML is this year supporting LAMP (Lutheran




